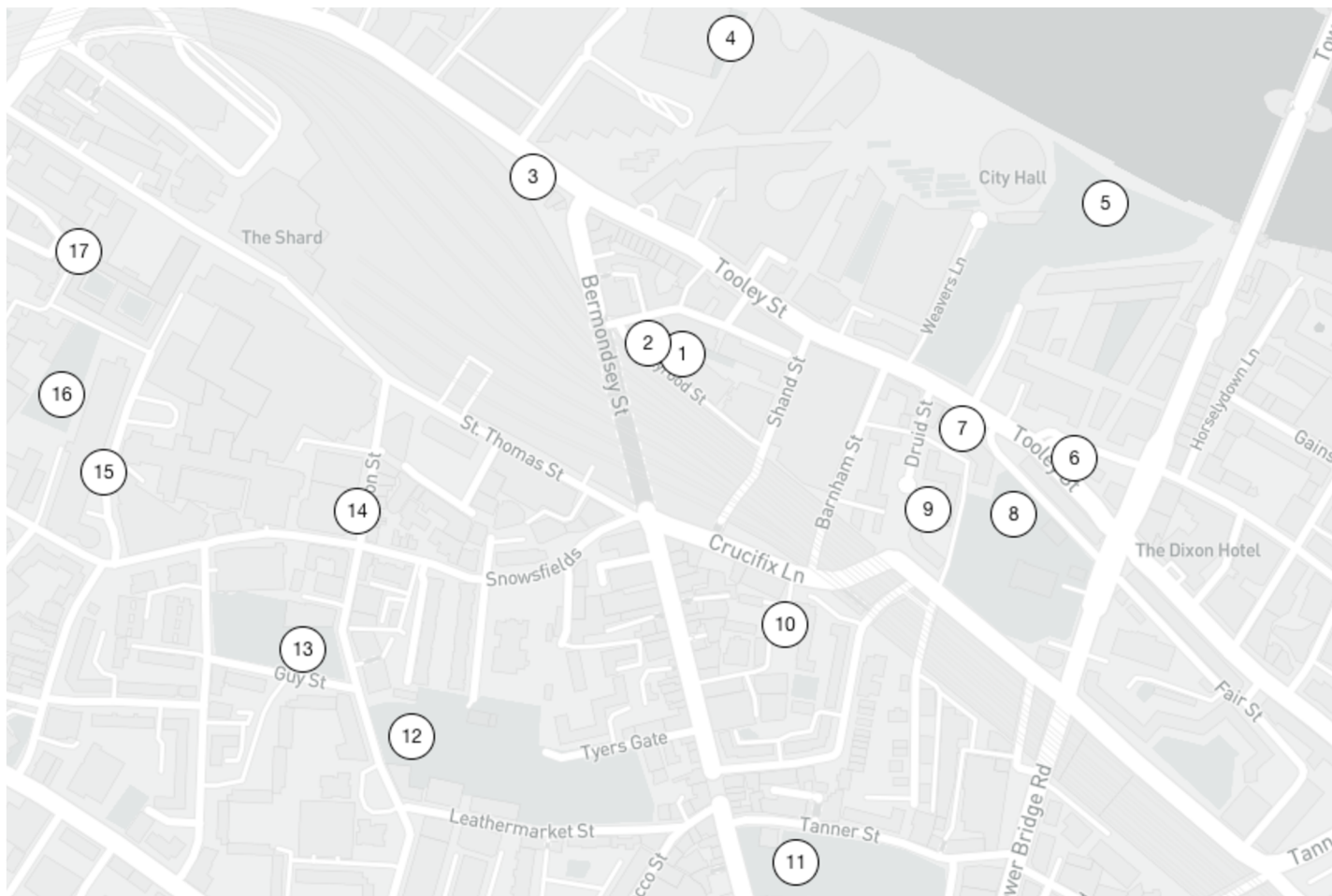


Green Space Trail



The green spaces around London Bridge shed light on its complex culture and history, and on the people and communities shaping its future.

1. Holyrood Street Kiosk and vertical garden: Holyrood Street, SE1 2EL

Above the award-winning kiosk, the giant planters build skywards with terraces of native herbs, perennials and climbers.

2. Gibbon's Rent Secret Garden: Holyrood Street, SE1 2EL

A historic and long-overlooked alley, Gibbon's Rent was transformed into an secret container garden by architect Andrew Burns and landscape architect Sarah Eberle.

3. London Bridge Station Planters: 80 Tooley St, SE1 2TF

Towering plane and horse-chestnut trees hint at the great age of this park, which surrounds the plinth of the lost church of St John Horsleydown.

4. Putting Down Roots Garden: Morgan's Lane, SE1 2HU

Originally an award-winning entry in the RHS Chelsea Flower Show 2022, the Putting Down Roots Garden can now be enjoyed in London Bridge City, beside the river.

5. Potters Fields Park: The Queen's Walk, SE1 2AA

One of the finest green spaces along the Thames in London with photo opportunities aplenty.

6. Queen Elizabeth Gardens: Tower Bridge Rd, SE1 2UF

A well tended public space en-route between Potters Fields Park and St John's Churchyard.

7. Fair St Living Wall: 7 Fair St, SE1 2XT, UK

Fair Community Living Wall was installed in 2013 as part of the "Drain London" sustainable urban drainage programme and extended to its full 30m length in 2015.

8. St John's Churchyard Park: Fair Street, SE1 2AH

Towering plane and horse-chestnut trees hint at the great age of this park, which surrounds the plinth of the lost church of St John Horsleydown.

9. Druid St Gardens: Druid St, SE1 2XA

Druid Street Gardens is all about new life growing from urban change. It is currently home to the RHS Chelsea show garden 'Repurposed', designed by Darryl Moore of Cityscapes.

10. White's Grounds Community Garden: Whites Grounds Estate, SE1 3JY

Residents and community groups have greened the communal areas of this estate, once the site of the historic Black Eagle Brewery.

11. Tanner Street Park: Tanner St, SE1 3GS

A popular space for recreation and play, Tanner Street Park knits trees and planting around four tennis courts and a playground with climbing web and merry-go-round.

12. Leathermarket Gardens: 13 Weston St, SE1 3HP

The gardens combine contemporary and traditional planting across two linked halves of a meandering site.

13. Guy Street Park: Guy St, SE1 3RS

The park combines space for recreation with flowering planting and places to relax.

14. Greenwood Theatre Pocket Park: 55 Weston St, SE1 3RA

A striking garden wrapped around the Greenwood Theatre. Look out for several beds and raingardens dotted along Snowfields and Newcomen Street.

15. Waste to Wildlife Garden: New Hunts House, Great Maze Pond, SE1 1UL

Made from recycled building materials to provide a green oasis where biodiversity is flourishing.

16. Guy's Memorial Garden and Courtyards: Collingwood Street, Guy's Hospital, SE1 9RT

A network of gardens to rest amidst the historic buildings of old Guy's Hospital (now King's College London's Guy's Campus), including two striking vertical gardens, one ivy-clad building, the other a modern living wall.

17. Orchard Lisle Living Wall: 1-5 Beak Alley, London

The wall has been carefully curated in collaboration with Scotscape with a diverse selection of species to provide year-long benefits to the local community and its wildlife.
